“NEWS FROM THE NEST”

The season is heading into its last six weeks and three sides have legitimate claims to a SMCA finals berth. The Sevens and One Day E's are in strong positions to take their season beyond the first weekend in March, and the One Day A's can join them if they continue their form which has seen them win four of their past five games.

The **First Grade** side broke the ice with their win against the fourth-placed Kardinya Lakes but are still 22.29 points away from the finals. More importantly, they are 17.55 points behind eighth spot and First Grade status for next season. Matches against top six sides Phoenix and Cockburn won't be easy, but a last-round match against East Fremantle could prove decisive.

Unfortunately, losses in back-to-back matches against has all but ended the finals hopes of our boys in **Third Grade**. With three matches remaining, the Crows are 23.72 points away from the 'Four. The one point in our favour is that our remaining matches are all against sides that are also outside the 'Four, so there is potential to rise off the bottom of the ladder with a couple of wins.

The **Seventh Grade** side have shored up a place in the finals and also reached the One Day Final on the back of a hard-fought win against Armadale.

The good form of the **One Day As** means they are just three points outside the 'Four with five matches remaining. Four wins in their last five matches have put them in good stead, but this will need to be maintained especially with three of their last five matches against sides who are currently in the 'Four.

The **One Day Es**, like the Seventh Graders, are expected to figure in finals action, which should be confirmed with one more win. The Crows should do this sooner rather than later as three of their last four matches being against teams from outside the 'Four.

Also, if you have access to any old scorebooks, team or player photographs, club memorabilia (caps, etc.), SCA/SMCA fixture cards or handbooks (pre-1985 or 1995 onwards), club or association yearbooks, etc. that the club can borrow for its historical project, then could you please let either Derek Mott or Rob Sims know.

Good luck to Simo and his Seventh Grade side as they take on Kenwick in the One Day Final at Mills Park this Sunday, everyone at the club hopes that the side can bring home the club's first premiership of the season.

FIRST GRADE

The Willetton Crows were able to break the ice and secure their first victory during the month of January and still have some chance of rising up to eighth spot on the ladder if the winning run continues.

The first game after the Christmas break was a Saturday/Sunday affair against ladder-leaders Leeming Spartan. The Crows batted first and made 125 with Richie Oliver jumping off a long-haul flight and into his batting gear to lead the way with 71. However, support was pretty much non-existent with only Chucky (14) joining him in double figures.

In reply, Leeming piled on 359 with Sav the pick of the bowlers with 4-58 and Andy Jacob taking 2-47.

The Crows hosted Kardinya Lakes in a crunch game for both sides and after Richie sent the visitors into bat, Tunni ripped through the batsmen to snare 6-18 from 6.3 overs, Sav nabbed 2-17 and Timmy 'Principal Skinner' Sewell chipped in with 2-18 as Kardinya Lakes were all out for 83 in 30.3 overs.

The Crows wasted little time in gaining the ascendancy, reaching 2-120 at stumps with Richie Soulsby unbeaten on 59 and Brownny racking up 37.

The home side declared overnight in an effort to fight for an outright but it wasn't to be as Kardinya Lakes opted not to take any risks and batted all day for 249 and in the process eliminating any chances of an outright result for either side. Tunni took 3-30 in the second innings (for match figures of 9-48), Sav had figures of 2-46 and there was one wicket apiece for Timmy Sewell, Bangers, Dimmers, Sloany and Brownny.

THIRD GRADE

The gap between the Crows and a finals berth is now just that little bit too far away after successive losses against Leeming Spartan have left Willetton nearly 24 points outside the 'Four with three rounds to play.

The first of the Leeming encounters was a one-dayer at Burrendah, where Ash won the toss and batted, with the Crows making 9-164 from their 40 overs. Nick Macek (41), Nev Ram (33) and Sloany (29) were all amongst the runs, but the highest partnership was only 43 between Macek and Abi, who made 8.

Willetton had Leeming reeling at 5-41 in reply before the evergreen John McGuire took the game out of our hands with a knock of 87 and Leeming reached 7-200. The best of the bowlers were BJ (3-20 from 8) and Ali (2-24 from 7), with one wicket each for Andrew Stear, Simo and Sloany.

The return match was a two-dayer at Trevor Gribble and Leeming held the ascendancy from early on when they had Willetton on the back foot at 4-33. Some dogged resistance from Nick Macek (21) as well as the lower order - Nav (16), Khan (14), BJ (11) and Pushy (10) allowed the Crows to post a score of 103.

Leeming responded with a total of 268, with Nav taking 4-38 from 13 overs, BJ toiled hard for his 3-66 from 28 overs and Chucky finished with 3-66 from 18 overs.

Batting a second time, Willo smacked 3-119 from just ten overs with Chucky slamming 59, Nick Macek belting 36 and Ali was unbeaten on 19.

SEVENTH GRADE

The Willetton Crows had a slow start to the New Year, dropping their first two games of the year before returning to form in last week's crunch game against Armadale.

Motty stood in as captain again and chose to bat first against Kelmscott at Willetton Reserve, but wasn't expecting his side to be 4-59 just before drinks. Owen Lawton came to the rescue with a sterling 80 and Keegs made 33 as the pair added 71 for the fifth wicket. The struggle resumed towards the end of the innings and the home side ended up with 9-167.

Kelmscott outbatted the Crows despite being 4-81 at one stage. Keegs was the only multiple wicket taker and the Crows were on the other end of victory for the first time since October 24.

Things failed to improve in their next hit-out against Canning Districts at Coker Park, scoring 156 from 31.4 overs. Owen once again led the way with 77, Dan Worth chipped in with 21 but the rest of the scorecard was far from pretty.

The elder statesmen of the side in Cloughy (4-37 from 7) and Simo (3-24 from 8) penetrated the top half of the Tigers' batting, but it wasn't enough as Canning Districts made 8-182 in reply.

Willetton made the journey down to Gwynne Park last weekend with the knowledge that if they won, they would make the One Day Final. If they lost, then they would not be there.

It looked pretty certain that the Crows would be on the sidelines after batting first and making just 119 from a paltry 27.2 overs. Nev Ram made 58 of the first 85 runs scored and Owen, Trev and Keegs all made 10 each.

The visitors had the humiliation of having to bowl for over half an hour before tea, but with Simo's pre-innings speech ringing in their ears, made inroads to have the Demons 3-38 at tea.

Wickets kept falling as runs kept trickling and it was anyone's game just before drinks at 6-91. Simo turned to Motty, whose second spell of 3-2 from 5 overs helped swing the game irreversibly Willetton's way, as did the tight bowling from Keegs, Simo and Owen.

Motty finished with 3-10 from 8, Simo nabbed 3-30 from 8 and Owen finished with 3-31 from 8 as Armadale were dismissed for 98 and the Crows gained an opportunity to play in Sunday's One Day Final against Kenwick at Mills Park.

ONE DAY A GRADE

The Willetton Crows are just three points outside the 'Four with five matches remaining in the home and away season, with defining matches against Bicton-Attadale, Forrestdale and Thornlie coming in the next three weeks.

Willetton's hopes of a winning start to 2010 were dashed by Leeming Spartan when they batted first and made a challenging 6-242 from their 40 overs. Maysie took 2-33 and was the only multiple wicket taker.

In reply, the Crows were 3-4 early on and slumped from 4-70 to all out for 92 in a disappointing batting display. Dobbo top-scoring with 40 and Kev Savige making 19.

The Crows were back on the winners list the next week when they defeated Armadale at Gwynne Park. Batting first, Willetton made 7-168, with the runs shared around amongst Dobbo (29), "Evo the newlywed" (27), Chad Forsyth (24) and Maysie (21).

Forsyth (3-20) and Maysie (2-16) also backed up their batting displays with the ball as the Demons could only manage 8-146 in reply.
